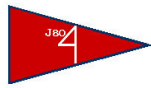

Notice of Race

The J/80 Class Association, J80 Fleet 4, and the Breakwater Yacht Club are the co-organizing authorities for this regatta.

1. Rules: This regatta shall be governed by the 2001 – 2004 International Sailing Federation (ISAF) Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), by this Notice of Race, and by the ISAF Recognized J/80 Class Rules (Class Rules) except as they are modified by this Notice of Race and by the Sailing Instructions. The regatta is subject to the Advertising restrictions as defined in RRS Appendix 1 (Advertising).

2. Eligibility: This regatta is open to those boats whose Skipper is a current member of the J/80 Class Association and the National Governing Body (US SAILING). This is a “Member” event as outlined in Rule C.2.2 of the Class Rules.

3. Entries: Entries shall be submitted by May 28, 2004. Entries received after the May 28, 2004 deadline will be subject to a \$50.00 late fee. Completed entry forms, with the entry fee shall be mailed to “David Jannetti, 14 On The Bluff, Sag Harbor NY 11963”. Late entries may be accepted solely at the discretion of the race committee.

4. Registration: Crew lists must be submitted at registration. Official weigh-ins will be performed at Breakwater Yacht Club between 0900 and 1700 on Thursday, June 3rd, and between 0700 and 0800 on Friday, June 4th. All crewmembers must weigh-in. In the event of crew substitution during the regatta, the new crewmember must weigh-in prior to racing for that boat's entry to remain valid.

5. Sailing Instructions: Sailing instructions will be available at registration.

Amendments to the Sailing Instructions will be posted at the Breakwater Yacht Club Clubhouse. It is the responsibility of each competitor to check the Official Notice Board for any amendments or other notices.

6. Courses: Windward-leeward courses will be sailed on Noyack Bay in the area designated in the Sailing Instructions. Offset marks and leeward gates may be used.

7. Schedule of races: Eight races are scheduled with a no more than four races to be sailed each day. The warning signal for the first race each day will be sounded at 1000. No race will start later than 1200 on Sunday, June 6th.

8. Measurements: Measurement is required and each boat shall submit a signed Owner's Declaration as required by the class rules. Measurement will be performed at Breakwater Yacht Club between 0800 and 1700 on Thursday, June 3rd. Random measurement may also be performed, and by participating in this event each competitor agrees to allow inspection of his yacht to ensure compliance with Class Rules.

9. Scoring: The Low-Point Scoring System, RRS Appendix A4 will apply. Eight races are scheduled. Three races will constitute a series.

10. Arbitration: For protests involving infringements of a rule contained in Part 2 of the RRS, an Arbitration hearing may be held prior to the protest hearing

11. Prizes: Daily and series prizes will be awarded (number will depend upon number of entries).
